
Day 1 - Choose Your Blog Niche

A blog niche is the main topic your blog will focus on. Picking the right niche helps you:

- Attract a specific audience
- Stay focused and consistent
- Stand out from others

Tips to pick a profitable niche:

- What are you passionate about?
- What topics do you know or want to learn?
- Are there products/services to promote in this space?



Top Niches for Beginners

f you're unsure where to start, here are some beginner-friendly and profitable blog niches:

- **Personal Finance** Saving money, budgeting, investing basics
- Health & Fitness Workouts, diets, wellness advice
- Lifestyle Daily routines, productivity, home decor
- Travel Tips, guides, stories, photography
- Food Recipes, healthy eating, restaurant reviews
- Tech & Gadgets How-tos, reviews, software tips
- Parenting Advice, activities, product reviews
- Digital Marketing Social media, SEO, blogging tips



Choose a niche that matches your interests *and* has room for monetization through ads, affiliate links, or digital products.


Day 2 - Choose a Domain Name

Your domain name is your blog's address on the web (e.g., www.myawesomeblog.com). Make it:

- Easy to remember and type
- Short and brandable
- Relevant to your blog niche

Tips for brainstorming domain names:


- Use tools like NameMesh or Lean Domain Search
- Avoid hyphens and numbers
- Check availability on domain registrars



Buy Your Domain

To register your chosen domain name:

- 1. Visit a domain registrar like Namecheap or GoDaddy.
- 2. Search your domain name.
- 3. Follow the purchase steps.
- 4. Set domain privacy protection (recommended).




Day 3 - Get Hosting & Install WordPress

Web hosting is where your blog lives. Choose a beginner-friendly host like:

- Bluehost
- Hostinger
- SiteGround

Steps to get hosting:

- 1. Choose a plan
- 2. Connect your domain
- 3. One-click WordPress install



Install WordPress Guide

Most hosts offer an automatic installer. Here's a typical process:

- 1. Log in to your hosting account
- 2. Navigate to 'My Sites' or 'Website'
- 3. Click 'Install WordPress'
- 4. Fill in site title, username, and password
- 5. Click 'Install'



Day 4 - Essential WordPress Settings

Before you start posting, adjust these settings:


- Set your site title and tagline
- Change permalink structure to "Post Name"
- Set your homepage
- Disable comments if not needed



Install Important Plugins

Plugins add functionality to your blog. Start with these:

- Yoast SEO SEO optimization
- UpdraftPlus Backups
- Akismet Spam protection
- WPForms Contact forms
- Elementor Drag-and-drop design




Day 5 - Choose a Theme

A theme controls how your blog looks. Choose a clean, fast-loading theme:

- Astra
- OceanWP
- Kadence
- GeneratePress

To install a theme:

- 1. Go to Appearance > Themes
- 2. Click 'Add New'
- 3. Search and install your theme




Customize Design with Elementor

Elementor is a free drag-and-drop builder plugin. Use it to customize:

- Homepage layout
- About section
- Headers and footers

Steps:

- 1. Install Elementor plugin
- 2. Create a new page
- 3. Click "Edit with Elementor"
- 4. Use blocks and widgets




Day 6 - Create Core Pages

These are essential for all blogs:

- About Page Your story and blog's purpose
- Contact Page Ways to reach you
- Privacy Policy Required for compliance

Bonus: Use plugins like "WP AutoTerms" to generate legal pages.




Write Your First Blog Post

Start simple. Share a "how-to" or listicle post.

Basic structure:

- Catchy title
- Intro with a hook
- Main points with subheadings
- Conclusion + CTA

Example: "5 Easy Recipes for Busy Moms"



Day 7 - Publish & Promote

It's launch day! Hit publish and start sharing.

Promotion tips:

- Share on Facebook, Twitter, and Pinterest
- Join blogging groups
- Comment on similar blogs

Use this simple format:


Mon: Blog post
